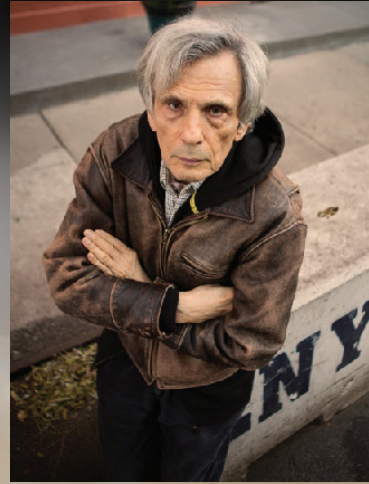

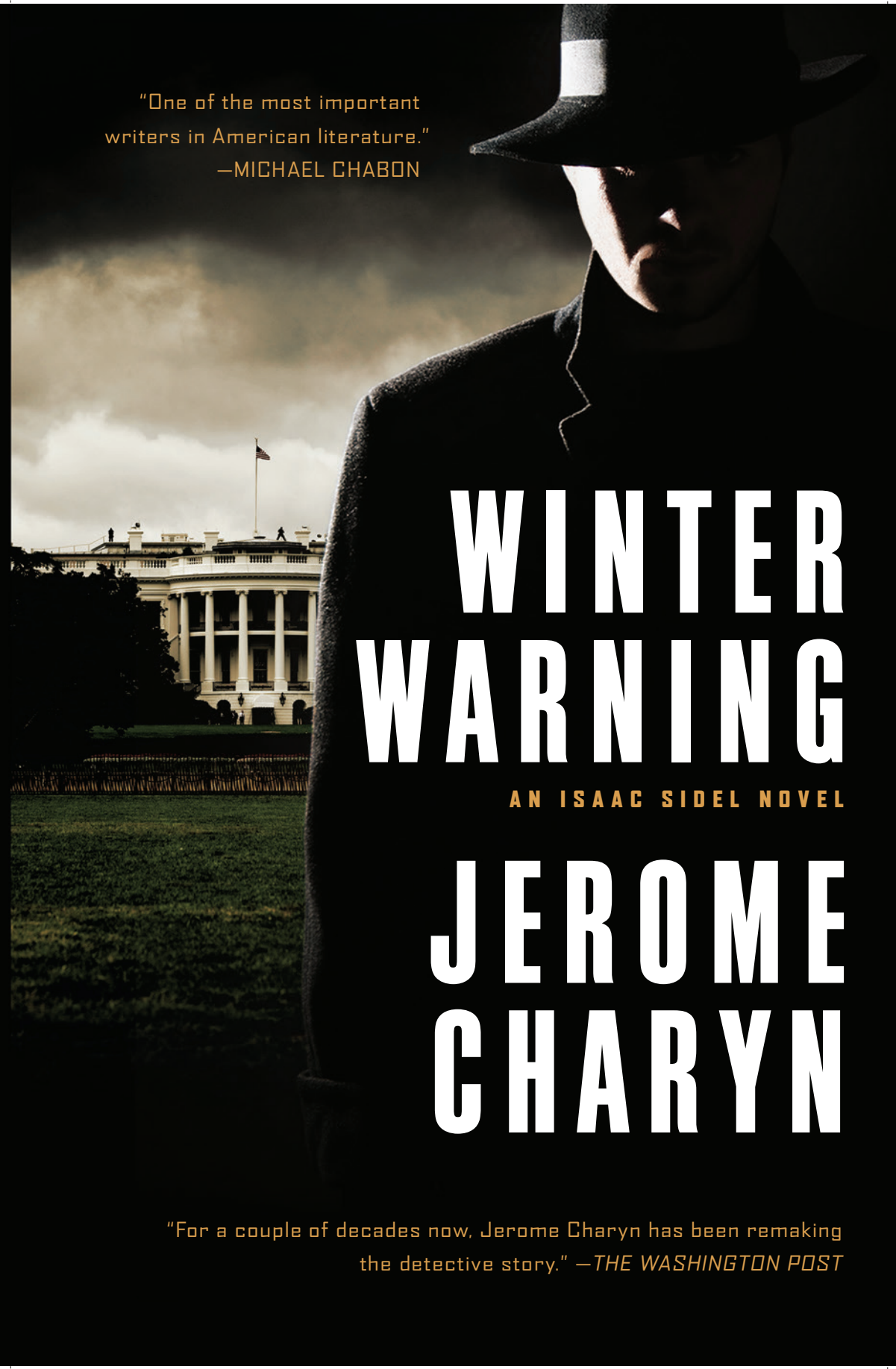

Reflecting our own world like a volatile funhouse mirror, *Winter Warning* lures us back to the 1980s, an era that could have been ripped right out of our most recent political upheaval. His only companions in the White House are the captain of his helicopter fleet and a beautiful naval intelligence officer—who quickly realizes that something has gone amok at Camp David, when a band of mercenaries arrive with their sights trained on Sidel . . .
